

**Halibut Cove Lodge
Homer, Alaska**

Depart Anchorage for a relaxing 4-4½-hour drive down to Homer, traveling along the breathtaking Turnagain Arm famous for its unusual bore tide. This drive has been voted one of the Top Ten Most Scenic Drives in America by Conde Nast Magazine. Be sure to watch for eagles, Dall sheep, moose and perhaps some Beluga whales feeding on Hooligan. You'll follow the Seward and Sterling Highway, which wind through a land of remarkable beauty of knife-edged ridges and alpine valleys and pass the famous Kenai Lake and River. You will also see magnificent volcanoes on the way to Homer. Be sure to include enough time to stop and take pictures at one of the many rest stops along the way. Homer is where the land ends and sea begins. In Homer, you will be met and transferred to Halibut Cove Lodge via boat. The lodge is located 12-miles across the bay from Homer, and is about a 30-minute boat ride. Or enjoy a 50-minute flightseeing tour from Anchorage to the remarkable Halibut Cove Lodge. Soar past mountains, terrain and majestic scenery while watching for moose, bear and other abundant wildlife. Your floatplane will land and drop you off right in front of the Halibut Cove Lodge, which is only accessible by boat or floatplane. The Lodge is built on pilings and a boardwalk, during high tide the water can reach the steps of the lodge, and during low tide the beach is left uncovered to be explored. Halibut Cove Lodge is located in beautiful Kachemak Bay on the Kenai Peninsula. The Lodge is nestled between Kachemak Bay, which is renown for its world-class saltwater angling and wide variety of marine wildlife, and Kachemak Bay State Park, which is Alaska's oldest State Park, with close to 400,000 acres of glaciers, lakes, rivers, coastal rainforest and alpine tundra. Few places in the world offer such a diverse variety of habitat, wildlife and recreational opportunities. The lodge offers something for everyone in your party. You can relax and read a favorite book or you can try one of the many activities offered to the guests of Halibut Cove Lodge. Try an exciting boat ride to a remote cove or fishing spot to try your luck at saltwater fishing for halibut, cod or salmon, depending on the season. If you're not a saltwater fisherman, you may travel by boat to a local stream to fish for salmon and trout and depending on the time of year you can fish for reds, silvers and humpy's.

If you love the water but don't want to fish, slip into a sea-kayak and explore the tranquil waters of this age-old fjord. You can kayak over to the village of Halibut Cove and explore the local artist shops for the afternoon. There are also many opportunities for hiking, mountain biking, photo-safaris, brown bear viewing, heli-tours, and spa services. There is an exclusive spa located right around the corner of the cove accessible by boat or sea kayak only. After a full day, join the other guests at the lodge for a relaxing gourmet dinner, featuring the bounty of the local waters, which may include salmon, halibut, crab or other shellfish, depending on seasonal availability. End your day in the sauna, or soak in the hot tub while watching the spectacular sunset!
