RESOLUTION NO. I

- Whereas, disease problems exist in nearly all fish cultural activities, and
- Whereas, regulations by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Food and Drng Administration, on levels of therapeutic drugs as food additives for warm-blooded animals are unsuitable for therapy of many of the diseases of cold-blooded animals, and
- Whereas, therapeutic levels of drugs in dicts of cold-blooded animals have not been covered by regulations, and
- Whereas, certain drugs have been used as food additives for control of fish diseases without demonstrable pathological damage when used at prescribed levels, and
- Whereas, all fish cultural operations suffer from lesses due to disease which are frequently unnecessary if proper treatment can be utilized; now, therefore,
- BE IT RESOLVED, that the Western Division of the American Fisheries Society at its annual meeting on July 15, 1962, does hereby recommend to the Food and Drug Administration that realistic treatment levels for therapeutic drugs added to diets of fish be established and governed by regulation.

RESOLUTION NO. 2

- Whereas, the Western Division of the American Fisheries Society has rescusseeded that the Food and Drug Administration establish levels for addition of therapoutic drugs to fish diets, and
- Whereas, the Western Division of the American Fisheries Society has also recommended that the Food and Brug Administration establish regulations to govern the addition of therapeutic drugs to fish dists, and
- Whereas, the Food and Brug Administration, if it follows this recommendation, should have the banefit of the knowledge of the country's fishery scientists; now, therefore,
- DV IT MESCLVID, that the Western Division of the American Pisheries Society, at its about meeting on July 15, 1962, recommend to the American Pisheries Society that it appoint a committee that will be available to work with the Food and Drug Administration in determining correct levels for hiddition of the appoint drugs to fish diets, and in developing adequate regulations controlling their use.

July 15, 1962 RESOLUTION NO. 3

- Whoreas, the habitat for gish and game is greatly influenced by logging operations in the Western States, and
- Whereas, the U.S. Forest Service has been helpful in requiring that legging on its lands consider the fish habitat during legging and road building, and
- Wherest, the current economic situation of the lumber industry has caused criticism of the Forest Service and its close regulation of logging methods, and
- Who cas, the continuation and further refinement of this regulation is essential to the well being of the fishery resource and the over-all natureal resource economy of the nation; now, therefore,
- IN IT RESOLVED, by the Western Bivision of the American Fisheries Society at its annual meeting on July 15, 1962 that the U.S. Forest Dervice be commended for its progress in this field and be assured of the Society's support of its position in this matter.

July 15, 1962 RESOLUTION NO. 4

- Whereas, fish in the public streams, lakes and reservoirs belong to the states to hold in trust for the people of the states, and
- Whereas, the responsibility for regulating the hervest of these fish is vested in the states, and
- Whereas, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, through its Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, now propulgates angling regulations for waters on its rofuge lands, and
- Whereas, this practice is not within the authority of the U.S. Figh and Wildlife Service; now, therefore,
- BE IT RESOLVED, by the Western Division of the American Fisheries Society at its annual meeting on July 15, 1962, that the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service be requested to refrain from making and promulgating angling regulations in the various states.
